WHAT IS YESS?

YESS: Yarn Ethically & Sustainably Sourced is an initiative of Responsible Sourcing Network (RSN) which aims to eliminate forced labor in cotton production through a due diligence approach.

YESS uses the OECD risk-based due diligence framework and aligns with the Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA) to enable yarn and fabric manufacturers in the middle of the supply chain. By joining as a YESS member, companies, suppliers, and stakeholders can take action on their commitments to responsible sourcing and ethical supply chains. YESS membership offers capacity building to meet the requirements of the YESS Standards, engagement opportunities to prevent and mitigate the risk of forced labor, and implementation of remediation as needed. YESS supports spinning and fabric mills with three main activities:

- Establish robust management systems and a strong due diligence approach to identify and address cotton produced with forced labor
- Develop a risk mitigation plan and build capacity with suppliers that have a higher risk of sourcing cotton that causes potential or actual harm
- Collaborate with local stakeholders to prevent and mitigate risks, and remediate harm when it occurs





YESS MISSION

To create an industry-wide due diligence program for spinning mills and fabric mills to identify and address cotton produced with forced labor in their supply chains.

YESS VISION

Yarn spinning and fabric mills are empowered and supported in the development and implementation of due diligence systems.

Industry actors, diverse stakeholders, and local communities are collaborating to determine root causes, assess risk, eliminate forced labor, and remediate harm in the cotton industry globally.

The YESS due diligence approach is expanded to address other labor and human rights, and environmental risks in the production of cotton and other raw materials.

MEMBER ACTIVITIES

Join as a YESS Member: Fill out the application, sign the agreement, and pay annual dues

Sign up internal team for the YESS Portal to access resources and mills' high-level assessment info

Review foundational training webinars, take quizzes, and become familiar with YESS Standards and resources

Brands and retailers engage at least two spinning and fabric mills in supply chain annually, help prepare to undergo, and follow up with YESS assessments

Attend quarterly YESS updates and engagement opportunities

Collaborate to address or remediate forced labor as needed, and contribute to working groups

ANNUAL REQUIREMENTS FOR RETAILERS AND BRANDS

Refer a minimum of two spinning or fabric mills annually and support their preparation and participation with YESS assessments.

Collaborate with mills, farm-level initiatives, governments, and local communities to identify, assess, address, and remediate forced labor in cotton production.





TIMELINE FOR MILLS
